1. Approval of June 1, 2016 meeting minutes.

2. Treasurer's Report

Ms. Higgins read the checking account balance ending May 31, 2016 into the record.

Ms. Voris gave the balance of the account as of July 6, 2016.

3. Police Report

Officer Fearon stated it has been a very busy season so far for the Marine Police Division. Calls for service have already surpassed all of last year. However, shellfishing has been quiet up until now because of the water temperature. They have also boarded the commercial boats in an effort to build community relationships and increase familiarity with the boundaries of the lease beds. He has not done the overtime patrols that were scheduled as one was during the transplant and the other was because water temperatures were too cold. He has rescheduled. He noted that some people think that if they have a saltwater fishing permit they are covered for clamming. This should be added to the shellfishing page and the message.

Mr. Dembski arrived at 6:55 p.m.

4. Recreational Shellfish Report

Ms. Voris submitted the following report:

The Commission has issued 553 annual recreational permits as of December 15, 2015.

424 are renewals and **129** are new permit holders. (76.7% / 23.3%)

Adult Resident Permits issued –	335	(\$	10,050.00)
Senior Resident Permits issued –	200	(\$	2,910.00)
Adult Non-resident Permits issued –	11	(\$	660.00)
Senior Non-resident Permits issued –	8	(\$	240.00)
Daily Permits issued -	7	(\$	105.00)

The Commission has collected **\$13,965.00** since December 15, 2015 when we began issuing the 2015 recreational shellfishing permits.

6 senior permits were issued to people who are 85 and older for free.

Ms. Voris gave an end of fiscal year report. The revenues and number of permits issued were up significantly from fiscal year 2015.

Ms. Voris also distributed an analysis of permits by geographical area that the Commission was looking to see. Westport and Fairfield were the two largest communities with permit holders.

5. New Business

a. Median Reconstruction and Resurfacing of I-95, Norwalk and Westport: Application by the CT Dept. of Transportation for the addition of a) twelve-foot-wide inside shoulders; b) new median barrier to provide a constant 6-foot-wide median barrier section; c) reconstructed joints on Bridge No. 00064, carrying I-95 over the Saugatuck River; and d) new drainage to alleviate flooding issues.

The Commission discussed the proposal. The bridge work is proposed over a natural bed. There is direct discharge of road salts and sands from the highway to the river from the highway which is not being addressed in this improvement plan. The Commission's comments ask that the DOT spell out the specifics of the sediment and erosion control water quality swale proposed in Norwalk. The Commissions comments included concerns about hydrocarbons, sediment and the Saugatuck River dredging, which is in the planning stages. It was the Commission's decision that this activity would have an adverse impact on the clam beds.

Ms. Mozian and Ms. Higgins are to write a letter to address the Commission's concerns.
