




### Changes in Norwalk PIT Numbers

## Chronicity and Veteran Status




#### 2018 CT Youth Count!

Youth are significantly undercounted in the Point-in-Time Count. A Youth Count was held separate from, but in conjunction with, the PIT Count. An estimated 5,054 youth under age 25 reported being homeless or unstably housed on the night of January 23 in Connecticut.


## Health and Safety
