Upon the request of the Superintendent of Schools, to authorize the expenditure of \$79,500 from the Board of Education Carryover Account to supplement the cost of awarding RFP #19-006 Master Plan Facilities Consultant to Antinozzi Associates as to meet the conditions necessitated by the terms of the Memorandum of Agreement date August 31, 2015, between the Board of Education and the Board of Finance creating the Carryover Account. The Board of Education also sends notice to the Board of Finance of its intent to utilize \$200,000 of Carryover Account Funds for the aforementioned award to meet the full contract price of \$279,500.

This item was withdrawn by the acting interim Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Bouno. No action taken.

7. Upon the request of the Finance Director, approved the issuance of refunding bonds in an amount not in excess of \$5,000,000.00 to be issued in calendar year 2019 for the purpose of refunding all or any portion of the general obligation bonds issued by the Town in year 2009.

The Board approved the "BOF Recommended Budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020" as follows:

- c. Railroad Parking Fund
- d. Sewer Fund

The board on a vote of 6-1 (M. Rea) voted to deny restoration to the Transit District.

Upon Motion by B. Stern, second by N. Dupier- the board approved \$48,000 restoration to the Parks & Recreation budget. Vote- Four (4) FOR (B. Stern, L. Caney, N. Dupier, A. Moore) Three Against (J. Westphal, M. Rea, S. Gordon)

BOF approved the final Town budget unanimously upon motion by L. Caney, second by A. Moore. Vote 7-0-0

Total Town of Westport expenditure - \$76,251,688.00 Grand Total Town budget \$210,697,563.00

9. Upon the request of the Director of Parks and Recreation, approved an appropriation of \$4,785,269.00 along with bond and note authorization to the Municipal Improvement Fund Account 30508810-500170 to replace four (4) Synthetic Turf Fields and the Staples Running Track, along with additional work associated with the replacements.
