7:22 Youth Services Report:

- Ct Coalition to end homelessness is seeking to get youth input on the issue on May 16th in Hartford
- Youth services funding is looking good
- A recreational marijuana bill is being passed through the state judiciary committee
- A state bill is being worked on to make all high school graduations on the same day of the week

7:35 Will Haskell Comes to WYC:

- School regionalization and keeping young people in Ct: Will wants to improve efficiency of education across the country. He feels it would be a mistake to regionalize some schools such as Staples, however, there are school systems that need increased efficiency. Will talked to the commission about keeping young people in Ct and working on making them stay. Will talk about the fact that the issue of getting people to stay in Ct is that workers find it too expensive to live here.
- **Legalization of Marijuana:** Will wants a strict legalization. He wants to tax it heavily, ensure the minimum age of 21, banning edibles, etc. However, he is unsure if this could be a reality with the rest of his colleagues in the state legislature.
- **School Vaping:** From Will's experience as a convenience store worker, juul and vapes are detrimental to those that use them both physically and mentally. He wants to ensure that vapes are harder to reach for minors so that people cannot get hooked vapes.
- **Participatory Democracy:** Will welcomes visitors and for people to get in touch with him on issues. He then shared stories about people getting involved and urged the commission to reach out to him about issues they feel strongly about.
- Getting Students Involved in Politics: To vote in Ct and to get absentee ballots is a difficult and lengthy process which deters young people from voting from participating in

politics. One bill Will talked about was to give young people (ages 16 to 17) the power to vote in municipal elections.

- **Biggest Issues Facing Ct Youth:** Every youth has a different perspective on this issue. Some of them range from gun violence to climate.

8:10 Peer Education and Awareness:

- MDAD: Jennie gives a rundown of the program to Will. Peer hopes to run the event during prom season. Aside from addressing drugs and alcohol, Peer will also include natural high and positive mental health practices.
