Appropriation Request for Boarding Finger 'F' Dock Replacement at Ned

Dimes Marina

The boarding fingers on 'F' Dock at the Ned Dimes Marina, within Compo Beach, have served well beyond their useful life and are failing, resulting in loss of buoyancy causing damage to the main dock system. The seventeen boarding fingers currently in place on 'F' Dock are from the pre-existing dock structure, and when originally installed, were utilized to provide a cost savings when the new floating dock system was built in the 1990's.


There is no option to repair the boarding fingers as the concrete floats are losing structural integrity. Therefore, we received pricing to replace the failing boarding fingers and required components. The pricing for the fabrication of seventeen new concrete boarding fingers is \$119,100, and the estimated cost for removal and disposal of the existing seventeen concrete boarding fingers and the installation of the newly fabricated concrete boarding fingers is \$120,000. This replacement is included in the 5-Year Capital Plan and the full cost of this project will be assessed to the boaters.

The replacement of the boarding fingers will provide new technology that increase resistance to ice damage.

The lifespan of the replacement boarding fingers is expected to be approximately 30 years. Being that Bellingham is a proprietary dock system; we must go through Bellingham for the replacement boarding fingers so that it works correctly with the current system. The removal, disposal and installation will be put out through the public bid process.

Therefore, the Parks and Recreation Department requests an appropriation along with bond and note authorization to the Municipal Improvement Fund in the amount of \$240,000.

Longshore Golf Course Irrigation System

The current control system for the Longshore Golf Course irrigation system is approximately 15 years old. We have had some failures over this past season and have had it repaired; however, the system is obsolete and Toro is no longer going to support/service this system.

It is imperative that the golf course has a properly functioning irrigation system. Without it, there is the potential for devastating loss to the golf course should the system go down without the ability to be repaired. Control systems typically need to be replaced more frequently than the in ground components. The anticipated minimum lifespan of this upgrade is 15 years, at which time a complete irrigation replacement is to be expected.

This upgrade of the operating system includes a new computer system, associated hardware, and all new controllers in the field. This will keep the infrastructure the same, while making it a more modern and more easily serviceable system. There will be no disturbance to the golf course as the pipes, sprinklers, and wires will all remain. This upgraded system will also have remote access, will provide additional lightening protection in the field to prevent a catastrophic loss of the system, will be able to identify the location of system failures, and is more user friendly. As part of the installation, Toro will also provide a map of all new controllers and corresponding sprinklers. The most vulnerable components of this system are less expensive to replace and many repairs can be completed in-house, therefore lowering our repair/service costs.

In order to match the rest of the current 3-wire decoder system that was designed by Toro, we must replace the controller portion with a Toro upgrade; otherwise, we would need to replace the entire system at a much higher cost. TPC is the sole distributor for Toro in our area. The installation of the decoders is being bid out.

Therefore, based upon the attached estimate, the Parks and Recreation Department requests that the Board of Finance approve an appropriation along with bond and note authorization to the Municipal Improvement Fund in the amount of \$125,000 for the upgrade of this irrigation control system. The repayment of this debt will be benefit assessed to the golfers.

Replacement of Town Hall Elevator

Dear Mr. Marpe,

This office herein requests an appropriation from the Capital and Non-Recurring Expenditure Fund in the amount of \$275,000.00 for the replacement of the Town Hall Elevator. The work will be a complete replacement within the existing elevator shaft.

The existing elevator was constructed circa 1976-77. At that time, the elevator Code only required a single wall cylinder. Current 2018 code requires either a new double wall cylinder, or extensive retrofit to the old cylinder, even for existing elevators, (See attached notice from the State of Connecticut). In addition, parts are becoming hard if not impossible to find. The last time the elevator broke down in March of 2016, it took over two weeks before we could find the parts to make the repairs. The parts that we did find had to be adapted to the old elevator equipment. Each year we continue to have preventative maintenance and each year the inspection reports indicate that the equipment needs modernization.

The attached cost estimate is based on the Engineer's estimate for our recent RFP #18-935T, "Westport Town Hall Elevator Modernization" along with a 10% contingency for unforeseen items encountered during construction. This figure will be updated on August 31st with the actual bid results.

Dear Mr. Marpe,

This office herein requests an appropriation along with bond and note authorization to the Municipal Improvement fund, in the amount of \$62,000.00 for funding Westport's share of the Design expenses for replacement of the Cavalry Road Bridge, (Bridge #04964), over the West Branch of the Saugatuck River. The work will be a complete replacement of the bridge deck and abutments.

The existing bridge was constructed in 1956 and straddles the Town Line between Westport and Weston. The Connecticut DOT determined in 2016 that the bridge requires replacement, and assigned the task of replacement to the Town of Weston. The bridge is eligible for funding under the Federal Local Bridge Program, which provides 80% reimbursement of expenses to the Town(s).

Because the Bridge spans the Town line, both Towns must share the remaining 20% of associated costs. There are two ways to split the cost according to State Statute. 1) Execute an interlocal Agreement between the Towns, or 2) use the default formula provided in CGS 13a-238, which apportions the cost according to the two town's tax revenue.

Westport attempted to execute an interlocal agreement with Weston to split the costs at 50% each, (at Weston's initial suggestion). A change in the administration in Weston prompted that administration to withdraw that offer and revert to the default formula. By the default formula, Westport has to pay 73.16% of the cost and Weston has to pay 26.84% of the cost, which results in a cost to Westport of \$62,000 with contingency. If figured at a 50%-50% split the cost to Westport with contingency is \$42,000

The attached backup information shows how we arrived at the above figures. In the current capital forecast, we carried a figure of \$50,000 based on our initial 50/50 split.

The Westport administration is attempting to discuss the issue of the cost share with the Weston administration, to try and get agreement on the 50/50 split. In the meantime design activities are proceeding and the Town of Westport will soon have invoices to pay. This office respectfully requests an appropriation to cover the worst case scenario of Westport having to pay the default share.

We anticipate the design process to take approximately one year, so we will be back seeking funds for the construction once we have an Opinion of Probable Cost from the Design Firm. Currently we are carrying a figure in the Capital forecast for Westport's share of the bridge construction cost at \$250,000, based on an overall estimated Construction cost of \$2.7 million. This figure will be revised once the semi-final design is determined and the two-town split is finalized.
