Greens Farms Elementary School (GFS) was reopened as a school in the 1999-2000 school year after a complete renovation and addition project. Fletcher Thompson was the architect and Gilbane was the general contractor for this school building project. Eight (8) Triad boilers and eight (8) Gordon-Piatt burners were installed as part of the building project.

Three (3) of these boilers are still operational. Triad has gone out of business and parts are no longer available for these boilers. Our maintenance staff has cannibalized the non-operational boilers to provide parts for the remaining three (3) boilers that are heating the school.

In an effort to provide expert advice on alternatives for replacing these boilers, we have engaged Fuss and O'Neill to review the current situation, the physical location of the boiler room space and to make recommendations as to the appropriate course of action in order to maintain our ability to heat the school.

Mr. David Jackson, P.E., Vice President will be meeting with the Board of Education at the March 5, 2012 meeting to discuss the status of these boilers and review options for the Board of Education to consider for replacement.
