- Real Talk
 - Moving the program to the winter or fall?
 - It is a bit too late for the program to occur- keeping it in the spring would make the program a lot better.
 - Brainstorm questions for the panelists, keep the program in mind throughout the year so we are not scrambling towards the end

- Programs that address mental health, equality is possible- the survey could tell us more about what we need to address

 We would have to keep this in mind if we were to try and implement this policy
