# Jim Ross reported on a conversation he had with Nancy McCormuck, Executive Director of ITN Coastal CT/Westport

- ITN provides a fee-based transportation for the elderly
- ITN drivers are volunteers and provide their own cars
- There is a small annual subscription and then a per ride charge
- Operates 24/7 and on a next day basis(same day requests are strongly discouraged)
- The Westport ITN has been in place for a year or two and become a popular and thriving alternative to D2D and driving

 Nancy agreed to come and speak in the Fall about ITN, their mission and goals and the services they provide to Westport Citizens

## **Sue Prosi (SWRPA) presented to the Citizens Transit Committee**

Sue gave an overview of the South Western Regional Planning Agency organization, responsibilities, history and current/future initiatives and projects in the SW region of CT. Sue was very helpful in providing insight into the role that SWRPA has played and will play in Westport's transit planning.

- SWRPA is in the process of getting a consultant to do a Westport Transit Study which should begin in the Fall and go into next year. It is NOT expected to be completed before the Westport 2013 budget is approved.
- The Westport Tranist study arose from the funding debate that has existed for several years and came to a head this year.
- The last SWPA transit study for Westport was done in 1992.
- The study will treview all aspects of the current system(operations, services and governance) and will include comparative analysis of other transit systems that serve towns similar to Westport as well as Peer Group reviews
- No public transit is self-funding; MetroNorth which may be the most successful transit system covers only 70% of their costs with fare-box revenues.
- Sue felt that in light of the funding/subsidy realities with public transit, that it is critical for the citizens to determine whether they want town public transit system
- Sue agreed to pass to Carl Lidahl studies and reports that might help the CTC better understand Westport's transit situation and history.
- Sue agreed to continue working and communicating with the CTC as their study begins and as the CTC needs her guidance.
