## Report on 2021 Recreational Shellfish Program May 5, 2021 Submitted by Susan Voris, Secretary to Shellfish Commission

We have issued **348 annual recreational permits** as of April 30, 2021. There were **272** renewals and **76** new permits. (78.2%/21.8%)

## **Closure Events**

As you can see, we have a great number of new permit holders. Some are permit holders that did not renew last year but a vast majority are new to our program. If we were to do a comparison of where we are today from this year to last year in the calendar year, we have sold 348 permits this year compared to 253 permits last year. For the fiscal year, we are 52 permits from meeting the same number of permits issued in all of last year and have two months to go. Our average monthly permit sales so far this year is 87.
