The June 21, 2021 meeting of the Westport Shellfish Commission was called to order at 6:30 p.m. via Zoom, Connecticut, by Chairman, Heather Williams.

1. New Business

a. 575 Riverside Avenue: Review of proposal to CT DEEP to extend a float within an existing marina.

Tom Ryder of LandTech presented the application. The proposal is for a float extension. The site is the building where Saugatuck Sweets is located. This is an existing marina, All-Season Marina now has 22 slips. The float extension will be at the south end of the existing float structure. A 10' by 14' float is proposed with float skid. The existing pile is proposed to be relocated. This proposal is just north of I-95.

Ms. Mozian noted the area is a natural bed and classified as Prohibited.

Motion to find there will be no adverse impacts to shellfish from the proposed float.

b. Report about visit from UConn Sea Grant regarding possible sites for shellfish habitat restoration

Ms. Williams reported what they saw when visiting Hendrick's Point with Tessa Getchis. They were accessing the resources and will prioritize projects throughout the State for potential grant funding. They also went to the West Beach of Sherwood Island State Park but this proved to be less attractive for restoration than Hendrick's Point. They also visited the Mill Pond to observe aquaculture activities in the pond. Hendrick's Point has been set with oysters.

c. Plans for summer clambake

The Commission looked at the proposed dates. September 9, 2021 was the preferred date with September 10, 2021 being the backup.

3. Treasurers Report

4. Recreational Shellfish Report

Ms. Voris submitted the following report into the record:

The Commission has issued **435 annual recreational permits** as of June 11, 2021. There were **327** renewals and **108** new permits. (75.2%/24.8%)

Adult Resident Permits issued –	238	(\$ 7,110.00)
Senior Resident Permits issued –	179	(\$ 2,580.00)
Adult Non-resident Permits issued –	14	(\$ 840.00)
Senior Non-resident Permits issued –	4	(\$ 120.00)
Daily Permits issued -	3	(\$ 45.00)

The Commission has collected **\$10,695.00** since December 30, 2020 when we began issuing the 2021 recreational shellfishing permits.

7 senior permits were issued to people who are 85 and older for free.

Closure Events

5/10 -5/12 Transplant - 300 bushels 5/28 & 5/29 - 2.5" rainfall

Norm Bloom did a quick transplant in early May. 300 bushels were transplanted from the Saugatuck River. We completed our depuration period with no rain events. Then there was a 2.5 inch rainfall event that kept us closed another 8 days.

5. Police Report

a. Discussion of Marine Police overtime for patrol of recreational shellfishing activity

Officer Fearon presented the report. Patrols have been done of the recreational beds. People have been in compliance of the regulations and have permits. He is thinking of shifting some of the patrols to the evening to also cover the Mill Pond, Hendrick's Point and other where there are issues. Currently there are staffing shortages that need to be covered. He noted the last two arrests were made off Old Mill Beach by restauranteurs from Norwalk taking extremely large amounts of clams in the evening. Officer Fearon proposed some dates for enforcement.

Ms. Mozian informed the Commission of an upcoming meeting of the Sherwood Mill Pond Committee regarding the aquaculture activities in the pond on July 7, 2021. She noted the Shellfish Commission has no jurisdiction over these activities but is under the State Bureau of Aquaculture.

b. Update on return to future in-person meetings

Ms. Mozian noted the July 7, 2021 meeting is cancelled. There is no meeting scheduled in August. By September, we could be back to in person meetings.
