  - 2) the Council of Churches of Greater Bridgeport (Larri Mazon).

On February 12<sup>th</sup>, Eric Falkenstein, the producer of Clybourne Park, will speak at the Westport Library. He is currently working on a play about Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. He will talk about what he learned that not many people know about MLK.

### 3. Other Programming

- a. Tracy Sugarman is speaking this week at the Library about his first novel (December 15<sup>th</sup>
- b. MLK Birthday plans: TEAM Westport is planning to coordinate with the Unitarian Church and the Interfaith Council for programming on January 20<sup>th</sup>. Judy has her great grandparent's manumission paper that might be used for display.
- c. James Basker (Barnard professor) has put together a history of anti-slavery writings (compendium). There has been enormous interest in this work since the *Lincoln* movie.
- d. We would like to contact the author of Sick from Freedom who is at Connecticut College to come to present to the community.
- e. Dolores has an article about African Americans from Westport in the Civil War.

- h. Celebrate Westport -
  - <u>Action</u>: Harold will ask Shelley Kassan, Second Selectman, about TEAM Westport involvement.
- i. <u>Indian Voices: Listening to Native Americans</u> by Alison Owings may be of possible interest as a book/author to feature here in Westport at some point.
- 4. Overall, for all of our programming, we need to be more visible and will continue to work on becoming so.

### **Education Committee**

- 1. We would like to have James D'Amico (Social Studies Department Chair, Westport Schools) come back to talk to us further about the new theme-based curriculum. We are exploring how extensively primary sources are used during instruction and whether this methodology can be permanently programmed.
- 2. We would also like to get an update on the diversity strategy for the Westport Board of Education: what is it, where is it, how does it operate? Recruiting teachers should be outlined as part of this strategy.
