Approval of Calendar: 2015-16 School Year

It has been the practice of the Board of Education to have on file school calendars governing two years beyond the current school year. Previously, the Board has approved a calendar for the 2014-15 school year, requiring Board approval of a 2015-16 school calendar.

In January of 2013, the Board adopted permanent guidelines to govern the adoption of the school calendar. Those guidelines are as follows:

- 1. The first day of school for students shall be prior to Labor Day.
- 2. Where possible, Columbus Day is to be a regular school day for teachers and students.
- 3. Both a February and April recess for students and teachers shall be retained.
- 4. Five (5) snow days shall be included.
- 5. Where weather-related or emergency conditions make a 182 day school year for students impossible to achieve, make-up days shall begin with the first day of the April recess and continue to progress to each day thereafter, until no longer needed.

Having discussed the nature of the proposed calendar with representatives of the Westport Education Association and the Westport Intermediate Administrators Association, the calendar being presented to the Board for approval at this time is consistent with all contractual provisions pertaining to length of work year for teachers, including the provision that has single day holidays and extended vacations for teachers the same as for students, with the exception of professional development days when students are not in attendance.

If more than five (5) snow/emergency days are used prior to April 18, make-up days for students and teachers shall begin on April 18 and continue with each day thereafter, until no longer needed.
