The meeting was called to order at 8:04am.

Welcome / Approval of Minutes – Harold Bailey, Jr.:

Susan Ellis moved to approve our minutes from the March 17, 2022, meeting. Catherine Lewis seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Comments - Harold Bailey, Jr.:

- The Teen Essay Contest awards ceremony was held on Monday, April 2, 2022. The essays were excellent and were written from different perspectives, but with clear viewpoints. During the ceremony, we named who the winners were and congratulated them. The essays are posted on our website where we'll post the entire ceremony. We'll distribute the link to it. Be sure to watch it if you missed the ceremony.
- Why is it so important to talk about race and religion and about understanding each other? [Slide Presentation]
- The Essay contest is and has been an example that shows WHY we should be talking about race. Also, just take a look at the values we codified at both the Town and the RTM levels as evidence of what talking about race has achieved.

First Selectwoman / Messaging Update - Jen Tooker:

Thank you and good morning.

Harold, you and Tom were at the essay contest awards ceremony. Obviously, I did not see all of the essays, but I acknowledge any and all of our kids who take the time and energy to talk about their thoughts on paper. It is a powerful exercise. Everyone should be congratulated. The three winners were really great. It's one thing to put words on paper. It's yet another thing to stand up to deliver those words in public. The students were all poised and very impressive.

<u>Tom</u>: We love the way the essays can amplify student voices. They engage students to have a true say and to contribute their thinking to the discourse. The essays were moving and thoughtful. Their deep sense of caring was inspiring.

<u>Catherine O</u>: Judy gave a great discussion of the role of the judges. We got a real sense of the standards to be named a finalist. Thanks, Judy.

<u>Jen</u>: We put out a press release asking for volunteers to apply to serve on any one of the five Town committees (including TEAM Westport) that have vacancies because of the complaint issued against the Town and me as Selectwoman about party representation on committees. The due date for applications is April 15th, so we have a week left. We have had responses. Andrea Moore, our Second Selectwoman, can





answer process questions. We will be working with Harold to make sure we have new members added to TEAM Westport who are in tune with the mission.

<u>Andrea</u>: The process: emails are coming in from the public. There is an online form to fill out; then, the applicant must send a resumé and a short letter as to why they're interested and the skills they would bring. We'll collect, interview, connect with the committee chairs. The chairs will communicate to us the type of skills they're seeking for their committee. I'll sit down and talk with the chairs.

<u>Discussion</u>: There was a discussion about the requirement for a 50% plus 1 person limit for majority party representation on Town boards/commissions versus the 2/3 limit stipulated in the State stature for boards/commissions/committees.

<u>Superintendent / Board of Ed / Staples – Tom Scarice</u>:

As public educators, we have over time looked at how public schools serve demographic groups of students differently. These include federal grants going back to Johnson. The "No Child Left Behind" Act under George W. Bush started to disaggregate children according to achievement.

On April 25th, the Board of Education (BOE) will meet and there will be a report on the final draft of the Equity Study. Nine staff members are working on the presentation – the same group that worked on the RFP. We are working collaboratively to do a succinct presentation and the action steps will be paused as we work over the next month.

April 25th is a public meeting. We had a rationale – to assess how each student feels a sense of belonging and connection to our schools. We listened to testimonials. This is a national conversation that we need to take part in.

We are doing a climate survey again. The emotional security of our students in 2019 showed up in a climate survey. We did not hit the mark on everything, and surveys create more questions. We shall look at policies and practices and how they are "welcoming" or not in our schools. We'll look at how our students and their culture are valued. There is national attention on curriculum and practices in teaching and learning perspectives.

We have had a great opportunity with the course on African American/Puerto Rican history. It is getting great traction and high enrollment. We need to look beyond that since we have kids for 13 years. We are preparing our students for that world they'll be in in the future. We are wrapping the Equity Study report up this week to be ready for April 25th and will post it a week in advance.

<u>Harold:</u> It is time to put support into action by encouraging folks to come out to the presentation and visibly show support for the work being done. It is ground-breaking because of the work and the thought put into it. <u>Lee</u>: We're excited about sharing the report. The FaceBook page for the BOE will carry it.

Policing – Deputy Chief Sam Arciola:

- We are now at a force of 62 with our new hires; however, we still have 2 vacancies. One of our new hires has been sworn in and another will be sworn in later this month.
- We are holding a Food Drive on Saturday April 23rd at Shop & Stop on Post Road East. This is an opportunity to support food pantries at Homes with Hope, the Gillespie shelter, and other human services locations. We always get tremendous support from our community.

<u>Affordable Housing – Jen Tooker (for Danielle Dobin):</u>

Affordable housing successfully kicked off the 830J planning activity for the Town. We hosted the first session sponsored by the Clergy. The second session is to be at Town Hall this Tuesday and will be sponsored by all of the political parties.

At the P&Z meeting on Wednesday, April the 13th at noon, a representative from New Canaan will talk about their community fund for affordable housing.

Westport Playhouse – Harold (for Jenny Nelson):

Next to Normal is the current production. It is about mental health and people of color; and the director is the same one who directed *In the Heights*. It's a tremendous production. Previews are going on now. Opening night is this Saturday. The Playhouse wants to get people back into the space; so, they are offering tickets to organizations – to employees and young people. Interfaith Clergy – No report:

Asian American Pacific Islander (AAPI) Westport – Patra Kanchanagom:

We are preparing for AAPI month (May) in Westport. The First Selectwoman's office has been helpful in planning. Monday, May 2nd is the kickoff.

- We have an AAPI Festival event planned on Saturday, May 7th, at the Y with snacks and a food truck.
- We are working with the Library and the Organization of Chinese Americans for a follow-up session on May 4th after the rally against South Asian hate last year. Where are we now? Asian hate is on the rise. Vicki Nguyen (NBC News) and William Tong (our State Attorney General) are coming.
- May 14th, 4p-6p we're conducting a Toquet Hall workshop for middle schoolers and teens. We'll offer free meals. There is an Immigrant History Initiative to talk about fighting hate through history. They've been working with boards on Diversity Equity and Inclusion.
- Grace Lin (noted children's author and illustrator) is coming to speak at all of the schools in May.
- We're selling T-shirts through April 10. This is not a fundraiser. The shirts will be available on April 29th. We are getting them through Nice Threads; they were designed by Rosie Jon and are beautiful. Harold: Please give us the list of activities to get out to everyone. Sounds tremendous.
