Be it further Resolved, the Board of Education sends notice of planned expenditures for items 1. 2, and 3, totaling \$200,000, to the Westport Board of Finance, and respectfully requests of the Board of Finance approval to use BOE Carry Over Account funds for items 4, 5, 6, and 7, totaling \$334,832, as to meet the conditions necessitated by the terms of the Memorandum of Agreement dated August 31, 2015, between the Board of Education and the Board of Finance creating the BOE Carry Over Account.
