Project Implicit

- Judy led discussion of the Project Implicit online bias testing tool as well as the Institute which maintains it. Question was whether they could/would consolidate results for all takers from a given group such as a town. For those interested, the objective would be to get a benchmark followed by periodically retaking the exam to see how things might have changed.
- Judy is forwarding information to all TW members so they can take one of the tests and be prepared to discuss the experience at our February 2 meeting.

MLK Event

• TW is co-sponsoring the tenth annual MLK Event with the Interfaith Council and the Westport Playhouse on Sunday, January 17 at the Playhouse. Keynote speaker will be Prof. Marilyn Ford. There will also be participation by area choirs including the Staples Orphenians. Many streams of communication have already gone out. There will be a separate parallel session for kids.

Diverse Books

- Zoe reports improvement over the past year in the uptake of the Westport Children's Library and School System re: proactively ensuring diverse books are a significant part of the books displayed and featured in programming.
- Zoe is hosting a Brown bag lunch on talking about race with children for the CT Association of Marriage and Family Therapists.
- Conversation on Race (how do we talk to our children about race) targeted for this Spring. Zoe is working with Catherine Lewis on this and is also speaking with ADL about it.
