# PRESENTING:

Tony MacDowell – Executive Director, Earthplace

Tony provided a brief update on Earthplace and a review of this year's budget request of \$105,000 for Fiscal year 2024/2025.

# Key points reviewed/discussed:

- Earthplace has been growing and doing very well.
- The \$105,000 from the Town represents 2.5% of Earthplace's budget and is a very meaningful component of their overall funding.
- Earthplace is 56 years old and has been running nature and educational program ever since.
- 1956 Earthplace was founded as the first nature-based childcare facility
- In the 1960s, Earhtp
- Have 62 acres, 84 acres if you include the Partick Wetlands that were recently added all with
- Harborwatch is a 38 year-old asset of Earthplace which adds tremendous value to Westport and the surrounding towns.
- 50-60 people on staff. Have part-time half full-time People assets are key to our success
- We have expanded our special needs services for kids and adults.

- Our Urban Youth Initiative saw 1,500 kids from Bridgeport come through this year, 1,500 from Norwalk in addition to 1,500 from Westport
- Our annual budget is \$3.5 million and we recently grew our cash reserves to one-year operating budget, so \$3.5 vmillion. Earthplace has benefitted from Trust bequests from key supporters of Earthplace over the years.
- Focus going forward is our 65 year-old infrastructure Cash reserves will help us update our facilities.
- Earthplace provides significant value to the Town of Westport
  - o Earthplaces delivers access to nature to Westport and the surrounding towns
  - o 10-15,000 people per year use Earthplace's nature trails

### HarborWatch

- HarborWatch provides \$47,000 in value of monitoring Westport waterways and Saugatuck River funded by Earthplace
- 7 Towns also support HarbourWatch and utilize their water monitoring services

#### Financials

- We treat bequests as non-recurring
- Earthplace does not have an endowment
- Grants are harder to forecast
- We know how much we can get from day care, summer camp, etc each year.

### Questions:

<sup>i</sup>Talk about staffing – Staffing is tough. Had to raise salaries to retain staff last year. Salary as a line item went down due to eliminating two staff heavy programs including Little Wreckers and some other staffing shifts.

How is the pre-school doing? Program is going great. Significant waiting list with lots of new Westport families.

\$1M in closing costs on a loan. What loans have fees? A small car loan and another small loan.

Talk about your earned income revenue stream. Earned income is summer camp and preschool tuition. Harborwatch has standing contracts with seven towns for water monitoring which creates a small revenue stream.

How do you look at deprecation? Reserved money for future Cap-Ex

How do HarborWatch and Sustainable Westport relate to the Earthplace budget? HarborWatch is a key component of Earthplace. Sustainable Westport used Earthplace as a fiscal sponsor to get established and are now an independent entity.

Voting

For Finance, Melissa Levy motioned and Rachel Cohn seconded the motioned to approve the Earthplace budget of \$105,000 for FY '24/25. The motion passed Finance unanimously.

For LMA, Candace Banks motioned and Karen Kramer seconded to approve the Earthplace budget for \$105,000for FY '24/25. The motion passed LMA unanimously.
