TOWN PROJECTS



GILLESPIE CENTER

The renovation of this Town property on Jesup Road is making significant progress. Managed by Homes With Hope, the Gillespie Center is an emergency shelter for single men and women, a community kitchen which serves 3 meals a day, and a food pantry. Located in the center of downtown, it is the only facility of its type in Fairfield County. The updates to the building will bring increased functionality, efficiency, and privacy for the clients. The project is scheduled for completion at the beginning of 2025.



SKIP THE STUFF



This townwide initiative, #SkipTheStuff, launched in May, in partnership with Sustainable Westport, the Westport Farmers' Market, the Westport Weston Chamber of Commerce and the Westport Downtown Association, to encourage our restaurants and food establishments to change the way they distribute accessories like utensils, napkins, condiment packs that go unused and are

just thrown away in take-out and delivery orders. Instead of these items being included in a takeout order they will now only be available upon request. In addition to the obvious environmental impact, restaurants spend \$19 billion on disposable items and local governments spend \$1 billion annually on managing the waste and litter - based on pre-pandemic data. This is an education campaign achieved by meeting with our local eating establishments and communicating to the general public through various platforms. Thank you to the leadership of the partners, as well as our Town Conservation Department and Operations Director for leading the way on this important and impactful sustainability initiative. Most importantly, a major "thank you" to the group of Staples High School interns who hit the ground running to continue this initiative and visit many food establishments to provide background and in-house reference materials that will help make this campaign a success in Westport.



REVALUATION



Every 10 years, a town-wide physical inspection of all properties is a State-mandated requirement for all Connecticut municipalities. In accordance with State Statute Sec. 12-62., the Town is conducting a real property revaluation as required for the Grand List of October 1, 2025. This revaluation will correspond to the tax bills that will be due beginning in July 2026. Revaluation is a long process, one that will take almost two years to complete from the start of the process to the payment of the first tax bills after the revaluation. Some homeowners have already received notification from the Assessors' Office related to the inspections of individual properties. Properties that have not been inspected in the past ten

years will receive a notice. Ultimately, all the neighborhoods in Town will receive notice of the revaluation inspections by highly trained, professional Town appraisers. While not mandatory, accessibility to your property is important to ensure fair and equitable assessments for all Westport taxpayers. Your cooperation is appreciated. Celebrate Westport


