### **DOWNTOWN PLAN IMPLEMENTATION COMMITTEE**

During August and early September, the Downtown Plan Implementation Committee made significant steps in addressing recent concerns, updating, and implementing the Downtown Plan. This included issuing and awarding contracts for 2 Requests for Proposals (RFPs). The first is for a consultant that will conduct community outreach for the design of Jesup Road and Imperial Avenue Parking lots in the upcoming months. The second is for a consultant to update the 2015 Parking Study and to analyze the feasibility for a parking

#### **CONSERVATION DEPARTMENT**

Did you know that 40% of properties in town have or are next to wetlands or watercourses? So, chances are, your property, or a portion thereof, lies within or abuts wetlands and/or watercourses. These wetlands and watercourses provide a range of valuable functions to everyday life, including flood control, pollution filtration, and wildlife habitat. This is the reason buffers are established around wetlands and watercourses.

Our Conservation Department is making strides in informing and educating the public about the environment and the wetlands in Westport. However, with increased activity in homebuilding, home renovations, and landscaping throughout town, there has been an increase in the number of wetlands regulations violations issued by the Conservation Department. Residents are reminded that clear-cutting, illegal fill, or dumping in or near Westport wetlands and watercourses is a violation.

If there are wetlands or watercourses on your property, please be respectful of these common resources. A permit must be obtained through the Conservation Department if you want to remove any trees in a wetland. Prior to engaging in any activity on your property, please consult with the Conservation Department to ensure that wetlands and watercourses are safe, protected and not negatively impacted. 
festivities on Veterans Green in front of Town Hall. Rain Date: October 30.
