Richard Epstein made a motion to except the work by the seven artists, Paul seconded all in favor.

The Susan Rabinowitz painting will stay in the collection the remaining six artists' work will be distributed within the schools.

Ive Covaci announced "On Fire, Energy - Climate – Infrastructure" an exhibition to be held at MoCA/CT and curated by WestPAC which opens on January 15 and will run through

March 2,2025. All work is on loan from the Town Collection.
