- Strategic Priority Review
 - A. Parking Lots Reinvention
 - 1. Downtown Lots Design Master Plan Reconnecting the Riverfront
 - (a) Jesup and Imperial (Police Station) planning and public engagement status
 - (b) Parking study updates and feasibility analysis status
 - <u>Public charette</u> will take place on October 23, 2024, from 6:00-8:00 pm at the Westport Library in the Brooks Room. Various attempts to inform the public of the event were made, including an email that was distributed to roughly 15,000 residents.
 - <u>Colliers</u> will meet and interview eight (8) focus groups, four (4) of which have been completed. The focus groups include:
 - 1) Seniors (done on 10/7)
 - 2) Library (done on 9/30)
 - 3) Landowners (done on 9/30)
 - 4) Farmers Market (done on 10/1)
- 5) Levitt Pavilion (tentatively scheduled for 10/14)
- 6) Woman's Club (TBD)
- 7) Advocates* (will be held on 10/14)
- 8) Families (will be held on 10/15)
- *Advocates to include those that have been vocal within the community such as RTM members, Markus Marty of Bike Westport, etc.

- 1. Downtown Lots Design Master Plan Reconnecting the Riverfront (cont.)
 - After the public charette and focus group interviews have been completed, Colliers will create a survey for residents to provide additional feedback. Once finalized; interviews, surveys and the public charette transcripts will be posted to the website.
 - <u>BFJ Planning</u> received approval from the Board of Selectwomen on September 25, 2024. They will create an update of the 2015 parking study taking a look at downtown as a whole: North and South of the Post Road.
 - An analysis of locations for a parking deck on the West and South sides of Post Road to be done. Three (3) potential locations for the deck include:
 - 1) Baldwin Lot to be analyzed on its own and, theoretically, with a portion of the Avey Lot (Avery is not owned by the Town)
 - 2) Bay Street Lot behind Walrus Alley and the Gillespie Center
 - 3) Police Station the lot behind the station to be analyzed with and without the Police Station remaining there. Police and Fire to potentially combine.
 - A parking utilization management study is being done to examine current parking rules.
 - Drone footage was taken (at various times, including peak parking hours) of downtown during July and August. More footage to be obtained during the Fall; requesting that some of the surveying be done on Saturday(s).
 - BFJ Planning uses a sub-consultant, <u>THA Consultants</u>, who will assist in the parking deck feasibility study. THA will look into any potential pitfalls with the area including environmental, geographical and utility issues.
 - The following suggestions were recommended to help with planning
 - Safe Streets and Roads For All is holding a public meeting on 10/17; the data from this meeting can potentially prove to be useful with downtown planning.
 - Public Transit to be included as a stakeholder; including but not limited to, suggestions for delivery truck parking.
